**General Admissions Requirements for Transfer Students:** Applicants with at least 24 semester (36 quarter) credits are evaluated on their academic achievement and courses completed at prior institutions. A minimum 2.25 GPA is required. The quality of the applicant's involvement in church, community, and school is also taken into account. Official transcripts from each college attended is required and evaluated for appropriate transfer of credit. If fewer than 24 semester (36 quarter) credits have been completed, an official high school transcript and ACT or SAT 1 score must also be submitted. The Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer (AAOT) degree satisfies all NCU general education requirements except 8 semester credits in Bible & Christian Ministry and possible electives.

**Limitations**

- A maximum of 12 semester (18 quarter) credits of non-graded (P/NP) courses (except where P/NP is the only option)
- A maximum of 8 semester (12 quarter) credits of PE will be accepted; no more than two with same course number
- A maximum of 8 semester (12 quarter) credits of music performance credits, unless they relate to the major
- A maximum of 16 semester (24 quarter) credits of cooperative work experience
- No limit on AP or CLEP credits. All accepted credits must fulfill graduation requirements
- No maximum military, fire, or police credits, but all accepted credits must fulfill graduation requirements
- No maximum vocational/technical credits, but all accepted credits must fulfill graduation requirements
